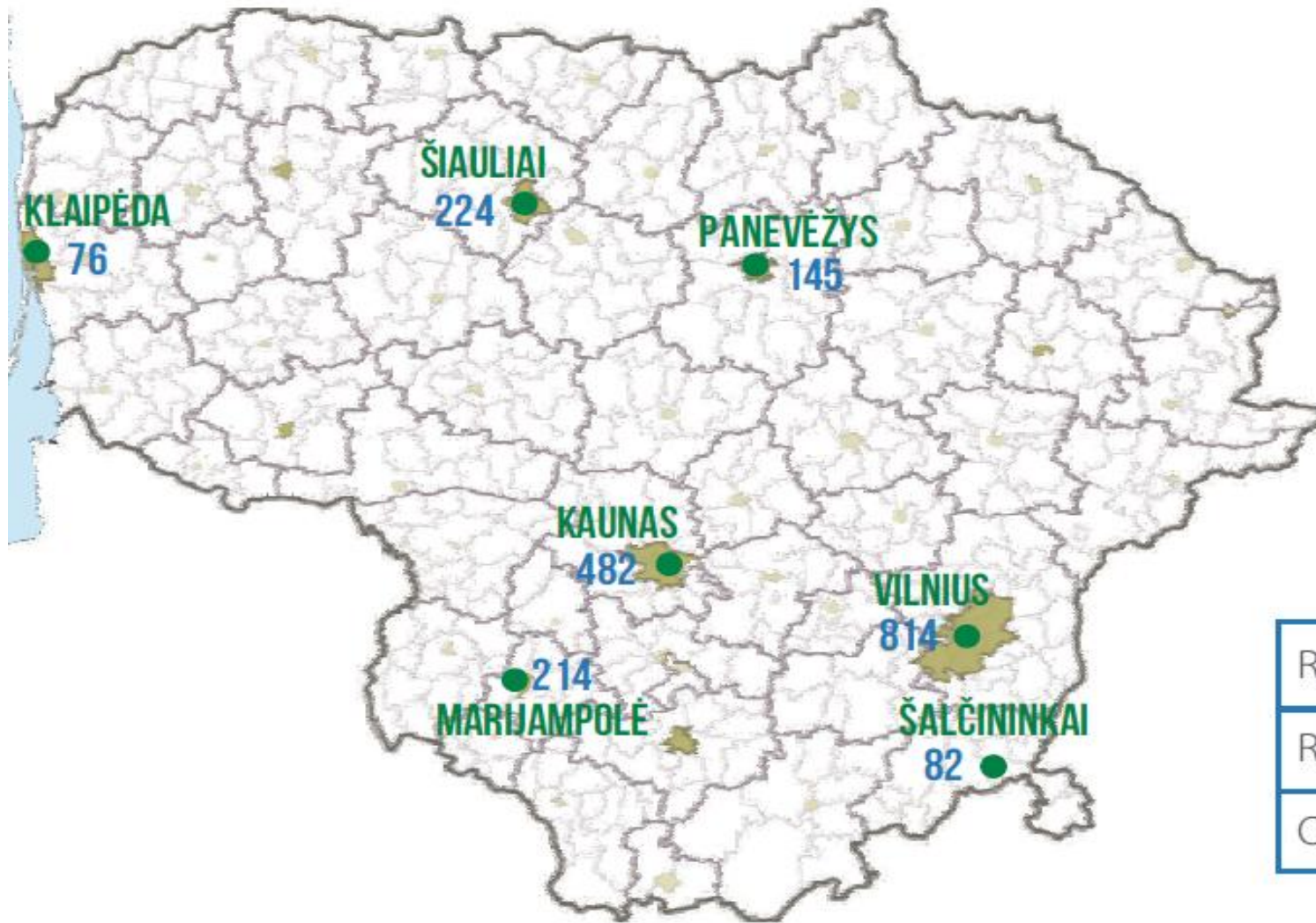

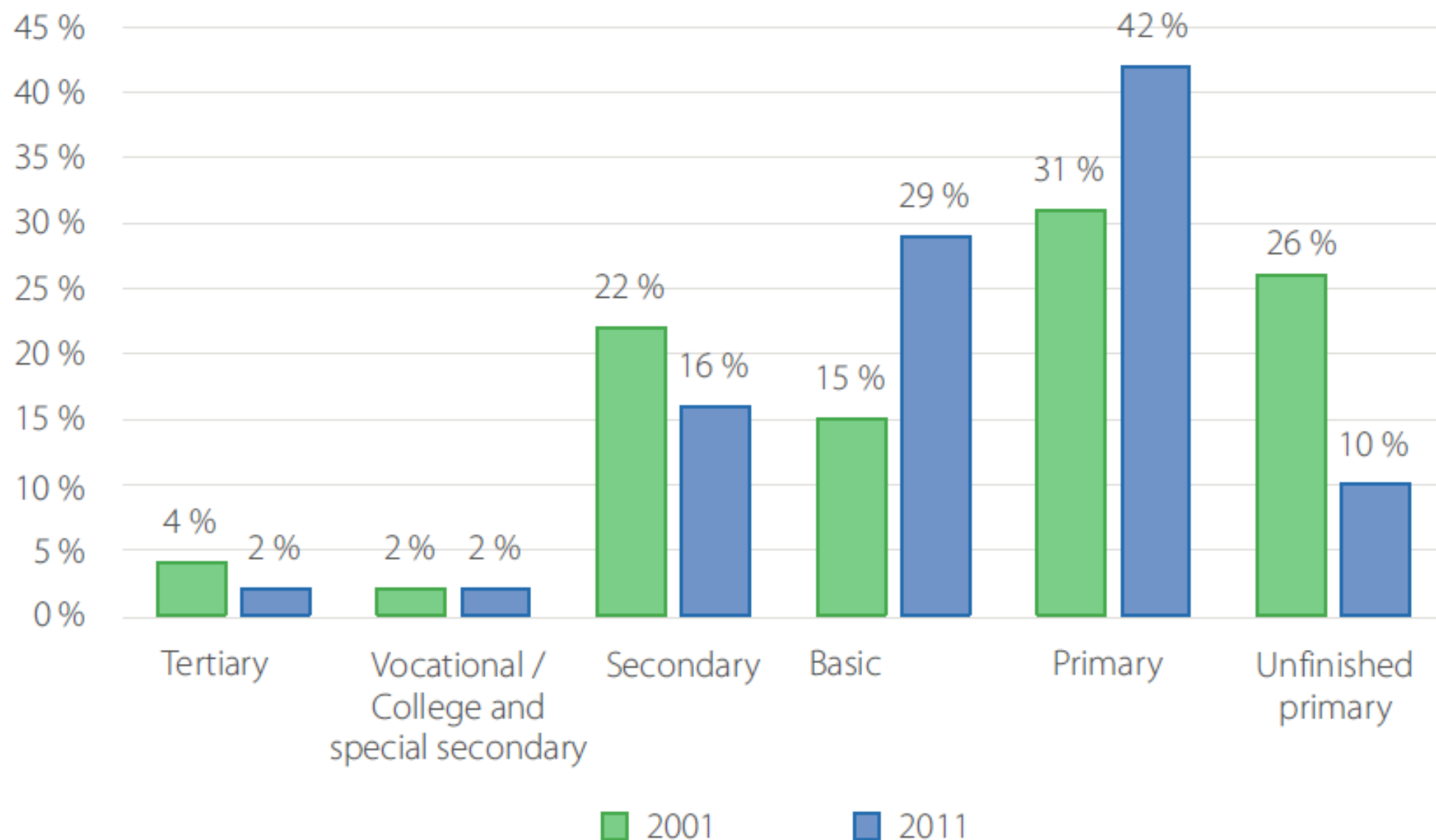

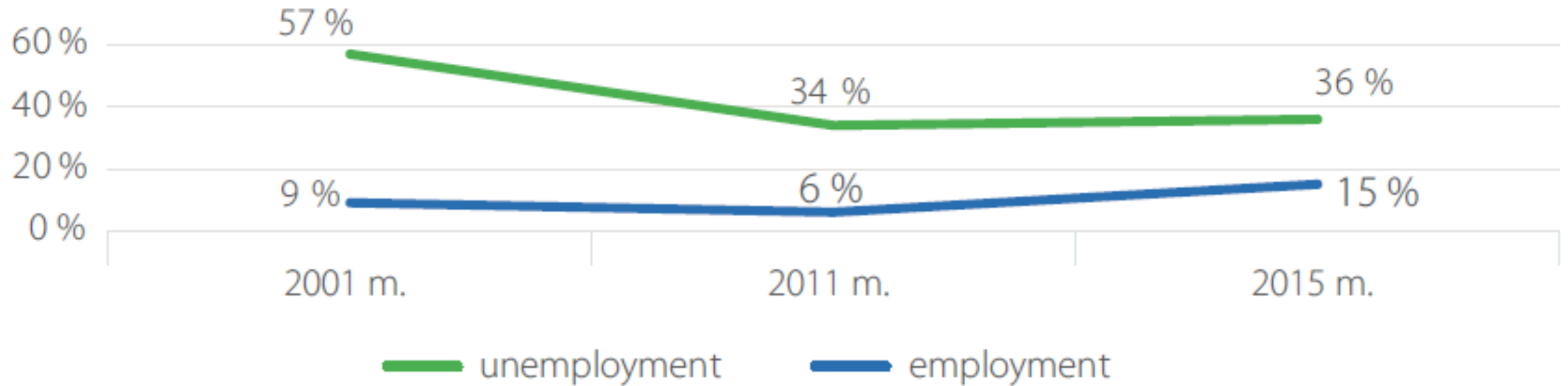

PROJECT „LET US WORK TOGHETHER WITH THE ROMA“ (2)

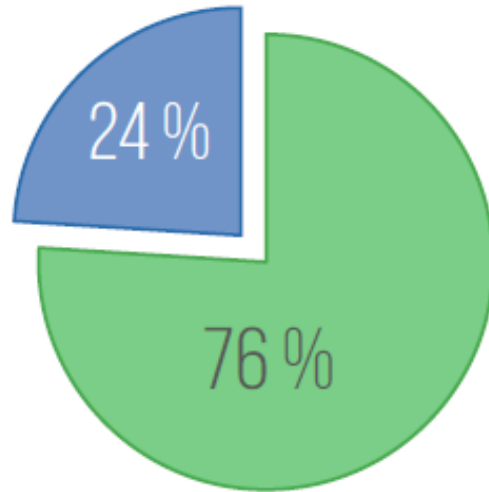
During the project 300 Roma will receive following services:

- Training on gender equality.



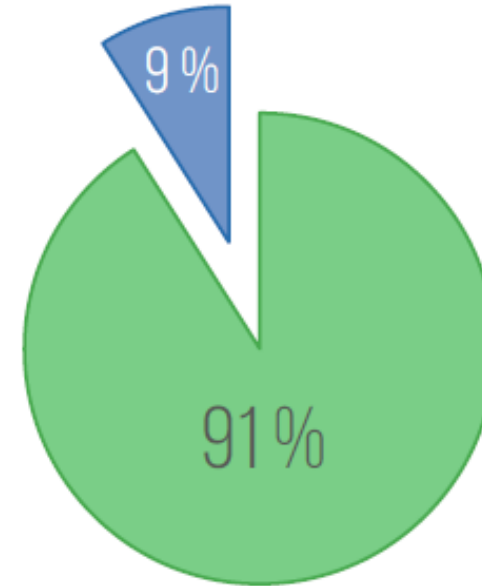

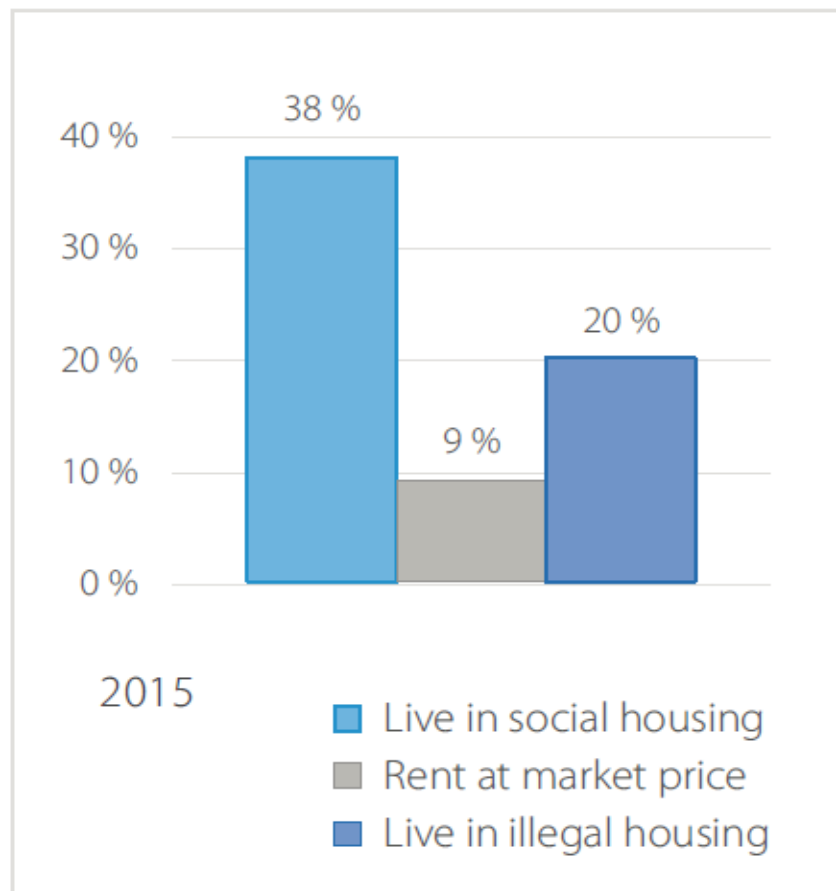

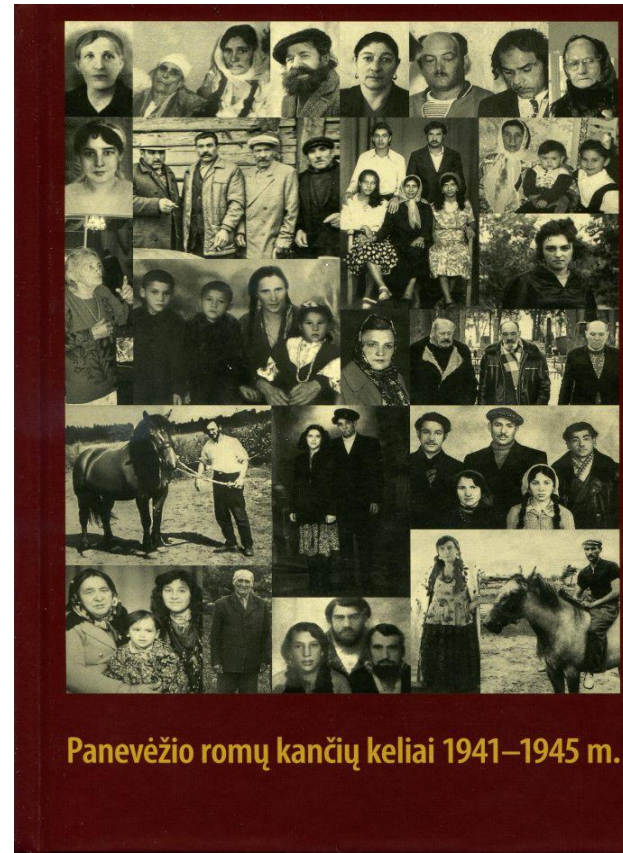

COMMEMORATION OF ROMA GENOCIDE ON AUGUST 2, 2018



Stumbling Stones (Stolpersteine in German, meaning literally “stumbling stones or blocks”) are commemorative plaques laid in footpaths or street pavements to commemorate the victims of National Socialism. There are currently over 60,000 such memorial plaques laid around the world, jointly comprising the largest open-air memorial museum.
